

HOW TO MAKE AN OFFERING OF LETTERS

Micah Challenge encourages you to use your words on behalf of the poor as an act of worship to God. All you need is a pen, 15 minutes and the desire to see our world transformed into a picture of how God wants it to be. You can take part as an individual or as a group.

Each year thousands of Christians in Australia write letters as part of the Micah Challenge Offering of Letters campaign and our message is being heard in the halls of Parliament. Every major denomination and over thirty different Christian aid and mission groups are supporting the campaign and we want to make sure these issues stay on the minds of our leaders asking them to act with urgency and compassion to help meet the basic needs of the poorest communities.

In 2009, the Prime Ministers office made an official response to the Offering of Letters campaign. It states in part: "... Thank you for the encouraging words from Micah Challenge for the Governments policies to address global poverty. The Government remains committed to increasing the Official Development Assistance... as part of global efforts to make poverty history.

The global economic crisis is making progress towards the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) more difficult. The impact of the crisis is especially severe in developing countries, and therefore the role of donor nations in protecting the poorest and most vulnerable is critical. In London in April 2009, Australia and all other G20 member states reaffirmed commitment to the MDGs and to achieving ODA pledges..."

The Australian Government has acknowledged the need for citizens to keep speaking out on behalf of the poor, especially in the face of a difficult economic climate. Taking part in the Offering of Letters campaign is one way Christians can respond to Gods call to "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute" (Proverbs 31:8). This is particularly important in the lead up to a Federal Election where we are seeking to ensure that poverty is once again a key election issue.



PLEASE take the time to personally hand-write a letter to the Prime Minister. Some suggested wording is given over the page, but please feel free to use your own words and speak of your personal concern for the poor. This shows you have put time and thought into the issue and your letter will be more powerful.

- **HAND-WRITE** clearly and print your name and address at the end.
- **BE POSITIVE** and encouraging.
- **PRAY** that our leaders will act.

Dear Prime Minister,

I believe we can act to see global poverty halved if we meet the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by 2015. This date is not too far away.

Thank you for keeping your commitment to increase Australia's overseas aid to 0.5% of national income by 2015, even in the face of difficult economic times. I appreciate the value your Government places on the MDGs and the increase in aid funding we saw in the 2010-11 federal budget. This will make a very real difference to our global neighbours people experiencing the crippling effects of poverty.

As your office stated in the official response to Offering of Letters in 2009, The impact of the global economic crisis is especially severe in developing countries, and therefore the role of donor nations in protecting the poorest and most vulnerable is critical.

I therefore ask that you make a timetabled commitment to your aspiration goal of an aid target of 0.7% of national income by the upcoming election.

I pray that you will have wisdom and courage as you lead Australia.

1. HAND-WRITE and personalise the letter please be neat.
2. Collect the letters and deliver them to the MP who represents the electorate where your church is located. Attach a cover letter explaining why your church is passionate about these issues, and let them know that it is something you will consider when making an election decision. Ask your MP to deliver the letters to the Prime Minister on your behalf. Visit www.apps.aec.gov.au/esearch to find your MPs contact details.
3. Please make sure your letters are delivered to your MP before the election.
4. Consider making an appointment with your MP at their electorate office to present your letters and speak personally to them about your concerns. Visit the Micah Challenge website to learn more about visiting your politician.
